IMPROVE LANGUAGE ON CATASTROPHIC VS 'REGULAR' DISASTER

TYPE OF INFORMATION
DATA + STORIES ARE CRITICAL
Eg: Sharing local knowledge first might reduce the shock.

Adults also need to be educated in Risk too!
