






Community-led approaches ... are regarded as the optimal approach to sustainable disaster recovery, fostering self-reliance and self-determination - Gibbs et al, 2021

Those most impacted should be able to shape their recovery - our survey












Some of the ingredients





Arnstein's ladder of participation (1969)






Local authorities complained that three months after the earthquake they felt like strangers in their own city - Haiti, 2010

Almost half of respondents feel they are not heard at all - Pakistan, 2012

When women were asked if their problems are being addressed, 73% said 'very little' or 'not at all' - Nepal, 2015





'There are times that agencies do not provide what people need. The projects come from above, top-down. They should listen to the people'

'Voices of people were not included. Only certain community members appeared to have the 'right' to be making decisions' - our survey

Participants highlighted that recovery work should be led by community, with the government providing resources and support - flood enquiry








Our survey









Why is supporting community led recovery so difficult?
